

MINUTES FOR GLENBURN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MONTHLY PUBLIC MEETING

October 20, 2021

Supervisor Davis called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with the pledge to the flag.

Special Announcement:

- Supervisors Davis, Wicks & Jennings recognized Nicholas Booth for his civic engagement and initiative. Nicholas won the statewide “Draw the Lines” competition sponsored by the Committee of Seventy. A Resolution from Senator Marty Flynn and a Citation from Representative Bridget Kosierowski were presented to Nicholas. The Supervisors also presented Nicholas with a Citation and Plaque and Declared October 20th, 2021 “Nicholas Booth Day in Glenburn Township”. Everyone in attendance congratulated and applauded Nicholas.

Public Comment Period

- No comments from the public on the agenda for tonight’s meeting.

Minutes

- Motion made by Supervisor Wicks to waive reading the minutes aloud and to accept the minutes of the September 2021 Township Meeting, 2nd by Supervisor Jennings. All in Favor

Financial Report/Presentation of Bills

- Supervisor Wicks asked if we have received any invoice from the Road Project, and he also explained about the change order on project. Secretary Treasurer Menendez said no invoice has been received yet.

Committee Reports

- **Police:** Report Attached for September 2021. Supervisor Davis also mentioned the recent car break-in at the Conservancy Parking lot off Waterford and Ackerly .
- **Roads:** Monthly report from Mark Hopkins. Supervisor Davis motioned to waive the reading of the road report and was accepted by all supervisors.

Unfinished Business

- Demolition of house at 325 S Turnpike was completed by homeowner.

New Business:

- Municipal Assistance Program. Information has been provided to the Township by Representative Kozierowski's office and the intent is to co-apply for a grant with North Abington Township. The grant will be utilized to update the ordinances, which has not been done in approximately 20 years.
- Glenburn Township is looking into acquiring a Radar Trailer for safety on our township roads and our Road crew while repairing the roads. The Township will review cost estimates and make a decision.

Public Comment Period for New Items /Issues

- Mr./Mrs. Paul & Roberta Czarkowski of Arch Avenue said they had an issue with the Waverly Police regarding their fireworks after 10:30 PM . After being told to stop by the officer, Mr. Czarkowski inquired if there is a noise ordinance and what was the time? He requested a copy of report. Supervisor Davis and Solicitor told him to contact the police department directly. Supervisor Wicks told him that he would inquire about the situation.
Solicitor Hillebrand and Supervisor Davis also said they will also check into the current township ordinances and state law.
- Resident inquired (via email) about the condition of a home on Cider Mill Lane. Supervisor Wicks will check into the ownership and status of home.

Supervisor Davis motioned to adjourn at 7:40PM and 2nd by Supervisor Jennings. All in Favor.
